Jacob Leighliter (1788-1881) - Our Most Prolific Progenitor

In 1899, George W. Campbell was publishing The Mountaineer, a monthly newspaper in Normalville (Fayette County), Pa. That September. as part of an ongoing series called Springfield's Early History, he ran an article on the Leighliter family entitled "Leichliter – Rise and Progress." According to Campbell, Jacob was born August 11th, 1788. Baptismal records from the Towhicken Church, in Bucks County, PA, note that Jacob was the first child of John and Lydda (Green) Leighliter. The family arrived in Somerset County (PA) around 1795, settling in Lower Turkeyfoot Twp. Campbell calls the place "Jersey," noting that Jacob "endured hardships and privation" early in life, but "grew with sterling qualities." The Censuses of 1800 and 1810 list Jacob's occupation as "farmer."

Around the time he was 24, about 1812, Jacob married Jemima Campbell, who bore him eight children; five sons, R. Campbell, Thomas, John, Levi and Samuel; and three daughters, Elizabeth, Mary, and Lydia. Jemima, died on Feb. 4, 1826. She is buried in a small cemetery on a farm north of Confluence, PA.


About four years after Jemima's death. around 1830. Jacob married Martha Williams. They had seven sons, David. Martin. Jacob. James. William Henry Harrison, George, and Albert; and four daughters, Margaret J., Jemima, Martha, and Sarah A. When Jacob married his first wife, Jemima, she was approximately 20 and when he remarried 18 years later, his second wife, Martha, was about 21. He managed to father 19 children with them over a period of 44 years!

Interestingly, Jacob and Martha named one of their daughters Jemima, born 17 vears after the death of Jacob's first wife. A person can't help wondering what second wife Martha thought of that? But the practice of naming a second wife's daughter after a deceased first wife wasn't uncommon in times when women often died relatively young after bearing large broods of children. Then there were two sons. Jacob Williams Campbell and David Williams Campbell, who bore both Martha's and Je-

researched her husband's (Duane) line. They are descended from Samuel C. Leighliter, the seventh child of Jacob and Jemima.



Ann has provided me with a very important piece of research. There is a Johann Lechleitner on the ships log of the Charming Molly, which sailed from Rotterdam with 57 passengers from the Palatine, and arrived in Philadelphia in 1773. Is this our John? If so it places him in America about 15 years before Jacob's birth in 1788 in Bucks County, PA. Fodder for more research.

About a year ago I heard from Melissa Leighliter Drewry from Florida, who sent me considerable info on her line, which is from the same Samuel C. that Beth and her uncle Duane are from. Beth and Melissa are third cousins.

A personal note: My granddaughter Danielle graduates from high school in June. Dani applied to 10 colleges (none in California) and was accepted at all of them. Guess where she has decided to go?? (See page 4)

mima's maiden names. These names show up again and again in the family tree, because people often named their children after parents or grandparents, a common practice even today. However, this complicates deciphering who's who when looking at the family tree (see lichliter.com– The-Descendants of John Leighliter). There are Johns, Jacobs, Williams, Jemimas, Marys, and Marthas in every branch.

The Leighliters were, as Campbell put it, a "family of ministers [and] teachers . . . [and an] influence of good example." Indeed, Jacob and Jemima's sons, John and Levi, were ministers. Levi "founded Wesley Chapel [a Methodist church] on his farm." Jacob and Martha's sons, Jacob and George, were leaders in their church, and Albert was a minister. Son David taught school and served as a local constable. That trend is obvious even in more recent family history. Several of the Lichliter men have been burgess (mayor) of Salisbury (PA). Levi (grandson of Jacob), and several of his sons and grandsons held the office. At least half of the members of the Steering committee for the LFA are teachers, either re tired or active.

Jacob's death on May 29, 1881, when he was almost 93, was followed within a year by Martha's on Feb. 28, 1882. She was 73. Jacob and Martha rest beside each other, beneath an unusual monument, in the United Methodist Church cemetery in Normalville, PA.



It's hard to know what Jacob Leichliter's life was really like. We do know that his parents were likely from Germany, and if so, he may have spoken some German. However, he married two non-German women. Jemima, was from Dublin, Ireland, and Martha Williams, was almost surely of English descent. With these two women he managed to produce nineteen children, 88 grand-children and 128 great-grandchildren (that we know of) There were undoubtedly many more. Now, after 10 generations or so, it's likely that he has 5000 or more descendants
