# LICHLITER FAMILY ASSOCIATION IS NOW A REALITY

At the August 2008 reunion, family members approved the concept of the Lichliter Family Association (LFA) and voted in officers: John "Dutch" Lichliter, president; Kay Ann Cober, vice president; Beth Gillette, secretary; and Debbie Spencer, treasurer. The following family members volunteered to join the officers in forming a Steering Committee: Mike Blocher, Christa Cober, Emily Jane Hickson, Bob Lichliter, David Lichliter, Bob Miller, Beverly Ricks, Ronnie Riley, and Phil Leichliter.



The Steering Committee held its first meeting October 11 at the Pine Grill restaurant in Somerset, PA, to lay the foundation of the LFA. In attendance were: Mike Blocher (Flagstaff, AZ), Kay Ann Cober and Christa Cober (Berlin, PA), Beth Gillette (Rockville, MD), Emily Jane Hickson (Confluence, PA), (Bob Lichliter (Camp Hill, PA), Dutch Lichliter (Santa

Rosa, CA), and Bev Ricks (Takoma Park, MD).

## The Committee agreed to adopt the following Purpose:

To learn more about our ancestors. To consolidate and preserve for future generations the work that has previously been done. To make contact and communicate with persons who share our common ancestry. To organize family reunions, publish a newsletter, and to maintain a family website. To locate, restore, and preserve ancestors' tombstones.

#### Next, the Committee tackled a simplified version of bylaws as follows:

Membership is open to all descendents of John Leighliter, (who came to Somerset County, PA, about 1795) their spouses, and friends of the family. In order to attract as many members as possible, dues are not required, but a one-time registration fee of \$5.00 qualifies individuals as LFA members.

A Board of Directors will oversee the activities of the LFA and consist of between seven and fifteen members, who will serve a 2 year term, and meet at least once a year (Board meetings will be held in conjunction with the Reunion when possible, and may be held by

phone or internet if necessary.) The Steering Committee is serving as the initial Board.

Officers will also serve a two year term. Standing Committees currently include, but aren't limited to: Membership, Reunion, Genealogy, Web Site, Newsletter, and Tombstone Restoration. Any LFA member may serve on a committee.

The Committee voted to have a reunion August 8, 2009, chaired by Kay Ann Cober. (See Kay Ann's article elsewhere for details.) At the family meeting following dinner, attendees will vote on when to hold the next reunion.

In order to have the **financial support** necessary for the reunion, website, newsletter, and tombstone project, the LFA will solicit annual contributions from members. Contributors of \$25 or more will be designated as **Sustaining Members**. In Deb Spencer's absence, Emily Jane reported that the LFA has opened an account at PNC Bank in Somerset, PA, with a balance of \$780 as of the meeting date. The LFA has also adopted a fiscal year of July 1 to June 30

After hammering out Association details, the Steering Committee also discussed the more enjoyable side of being part of the LFA. Mike Blocher. Webmaster. reported on the status Lichliter.com. He suggested moving the web server from his house to an on-line site and making access to most information on the site password protected. (Since the meeting, Lichliter.com has been placed with a web hosting service. The user-name and password required to access the private areas are "lichliter" and "lichliter")

Dutch will continue to publish *The Lantern* four times a year, with Bev Ricks as editor. Both publisher and editor emphasized the importance of family members contributing articles. Also under consideration are regular features, such as quizzes on Lichliter history, family, and/or events, articles highlighting ancestors and living family members, and an "I Remember..." section.

Dutch has also located many of the oldest graves of early Lichliter ancestors in Somerset and Fayette Counties. But they are showing wear and should be cleaned, repaired, and preserved. The committee unanimously supported a tombstone restoration project and will be looking for help from interested family members in addition to considering hiring expert help if necessary. The work will

begin with Jacob and Martha Leichliter's graves in Normalville, PA. Work on the grave of Jemima Campbell, Jacob's first wife, is also being considered.

The final item on the agenda, the "piece de résistance"— an LFA crest! Designed by Rick Pepper, husband or Sheri (Lichliter) Pepper and son-in-law of Dutch, a classic gaslight style lantern will be used to represent the family and its heritage.

The officers and Steering Committee have put in a lot of hours to create the LFA, set up the website, publish *The Lantern*, and plan the reunions. And even though their gratification comes from knowing they have carved out a way to preserve the family's heritage that can be passed on to future generations, we want to say **Thanks**!



#### THE LFA CREST

The crest incorporates the three main spellings of the Family name. The Lantern signifies the purpose of the LFA: to illuminate the Family history. 1788 is the birth year of Jacob Leighliter, our most prolific progenitor, and 2008 is the year the LFA was formed.



Harrison, "Old Tippecanoe", who was born on February 9<sup>th</sup>. 1773. You may recall that Old Tip was the shortest serving of all our Presidents. He took the oath of office on March 4, 1841, on a cold and windy day, and didn't wear a coat or hat. He caught pneumonia, and died one month later.

So we can speculate on the significance of Jacob and Martha Leighliter naming their son after the newly elected, but not yet inaugurated, 9<sup>th</sup> President. A quick check with Wikipedia shows that Harrison was a soldier, an Episcopalian, and a member of the Whig party. The Whig's opposed the policies of Andrew Jackson and the Democratic Party, and favored supremacy of Congress over the

Executive Branch. They favored a program of modernization and economic protectionism. The Whig Party only lasted about 20 years, and was succeeded by the Free Soil Party, the Know-Nothing Party and finally, the Republican Party. Can we infer that our early ancestors might have shared these political views? Fun to speculate.

PS: And, guess what? The great-grandfather of Edith Lichliter Clark (whose family is pictured below) was named Henry Harrison Lichliter. He was the brother of our Levi of Salisbury. He was born in October of 1841. So although he was now deceased, Harrison was apparently still popular enough that some people would name their son after him.
